

### **Nuclear War**



Score Trend (Week of June 15-21, 2025)



This week, the nuclear threat level has consistently been elevated due to escalating tensions between Israel and Iran, with particular concerns over Iran's nuclear capabilities and ambitions. 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### **Pandemics**



Score Trend (Week of June 15-21, 2025)



This week, the pandemic risk level has fluctuated between moderate and high, primarily due to the resurgence of COVID-19 variants, ongoing avian flu threats, and the emergence of other infectious diseases such as measles and MERS. A significant challenge remains the erosion of public trust in vaccines, exacerbated by widespread misinformation. The situation is compounded by difficulties in the public health response, highlighting the need for improved communication strategies and enhanced surveillance efforts. Despite these challenges, the overall risk score has remained relatively stable, indicating a persistent but manageable threat level.

### **Pandemics**



- [Government] Enhance surveillance and genomic sequencing efforts to monitor and respond to emerging COVID-19 variants and other infectious diseases.
- [Public Health Organizations] Launch targeted campaigns to counter misinformation and rebuild public trust in vaccines through transparent and consistent communication.
- **[NGO]** Strengthen global cooperation to address avian flu outbreaks and prevent potential zoonotic spillovers, focusing on regions with high risk of cross-species transmission.
- [Healthcare Providers] Prioritize vaccination campaigns, especially for high-risk populations, to mitigate the impact of COVID-19, flu, and other emerging infectious diseases.
- [Research Institutions] Accelerate research on vaccine efficacy against new COVID-19 variants and other emerging pathogens to ensure timely updates to vaccination protocols.

Score Trend (Week of June 15-21, 2025)



This week, the global misinformation threat level remains high, with a consistent score around 4.2. The primary drivers include politically motivated disinformation, fake news related to geopolitical tensions, and scams proliferating on digital platforms. There is a notable increase in the use of Al-driven disinformation, particularly in the context of geopolitical conflicts. These campaigns are affecting election narratives and contributing to widespread health misinformation. The persistence of these issues highlights the ongoing challenges in maintaining information integrity across various sectors.

- [Government] Implement stricter regulations and penalties for spreading disinformation, especially during election periods and in the context of geopolitical tensions.
- [Industry] Enhance AI detection systems to identify and remove fake content more effectively, focusing on AI-generated disinformation and deepfakes.
- **[NGO]** Increase efforts in fact-checking and provide clear, accessible corrections to misinformation, prioritizing election narratives and health misinformation.
- [Education] Integrate media literacy programs into curricula to equip students with skills to critically evaluate information and identify misinformation.
- [International Organizations] Foster cross-border collaborations to tackle misinformation that affects global peace and security, sharing best practices and resources.



Score Trend (Week of June 15-21, 2025)

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# Week in Review: June 15-21, 2025



This week, existential risk trends across the six domains have shown notable developments. In the nuclear domain, heightened tensions between Israel and Iran, alongside global nuclear arsenal expansions, have kept the risk level elevated, emphasizing the need for diplomatic efforts and treaty negotiations. Artificial Intelligence risks remain moderate to high due to advancements in AI integration in critical sectors, underscoring the necessity for regulatory measures and international cooperation. Climate change risks persist at high levels, driven by extreme weather events and inadequate policy responses, highlighting the urgency for effective climate action. Pandemic risks fluctuate between moderate and high, with emerging infectious diseases and vaccine misinformation posing ongoing challenges. Information integrity threats remain high, fueled by Al-driven disinformation campaigns affecting geopolitical and health narratives. Lastly, the unknown/black swan domain is marked by increased geopolitical tensions due to Israel's military actions against Iran, raising concerns about regional destabilization and global impacts.
