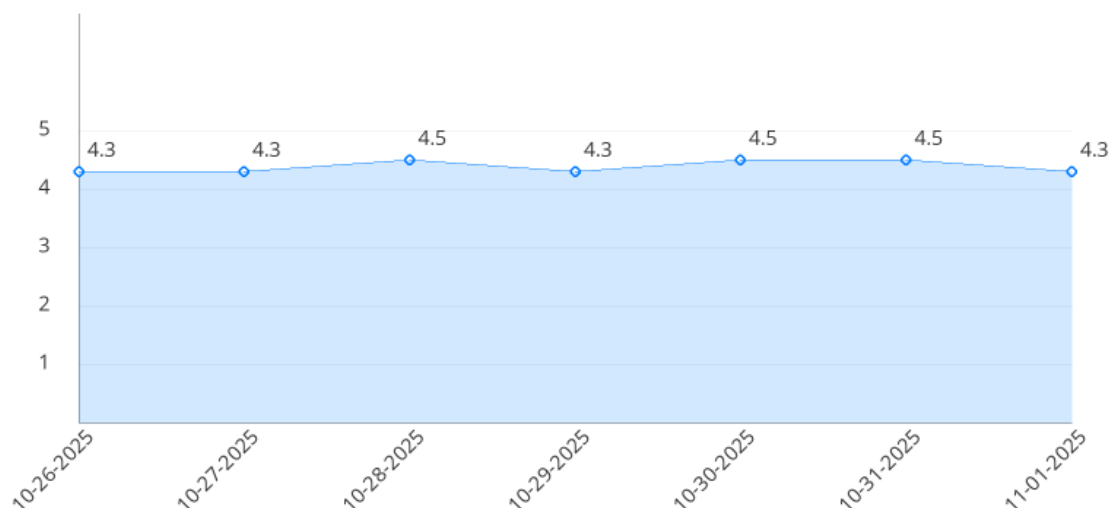

Nuclear War

Score Trend (Week of October 26–1, 2025)



This week has seen a significant increase in global nuclear tensions, driven by several key developments. Russia's military buildup in the Arctic and NATO's increased nuclear drills have heightened tensions, while U.S. agency furloughs have reduced crisis communication capabilities. Additionally, the directive to resume U.S. nuclear weapons testing after a 33-year hiatus has raised concerns about a renewed arms race. The breakdown of nuclear arms control treaties and modernization efforts further exacerbate the situation, increasing the global nuclear threat level. These developments underscore the urgent need for diplomatic engagement and enhanced communication protocols to prevent escalation.

- **[International Organizations]** Facilitate urgent diplomatic talks between NATO and Russia to de-escalate tensions in the Arctic region.
- **[Military]** Enhance crisis communication channels and conduct joint exercises focused on de-escalation and crisis management.

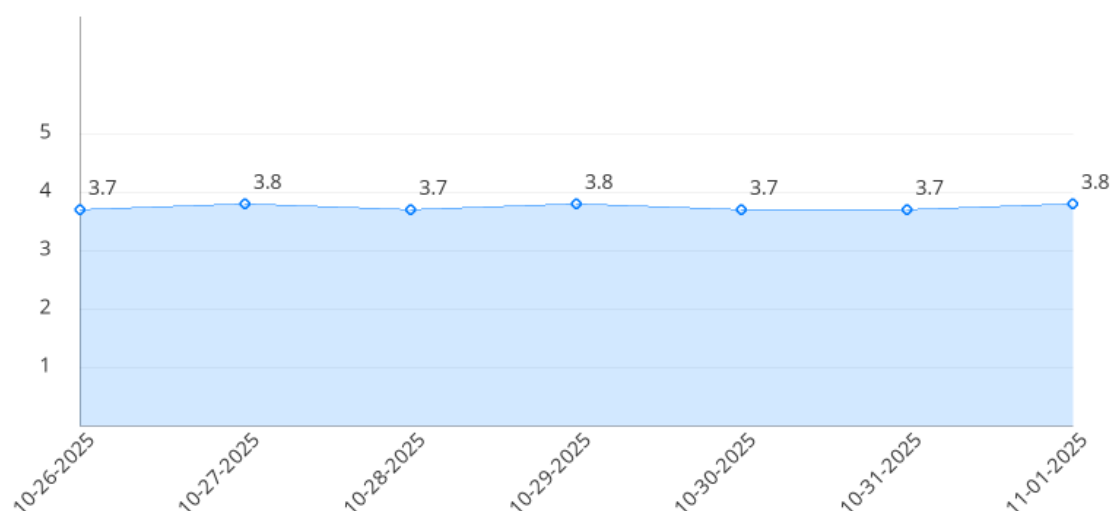

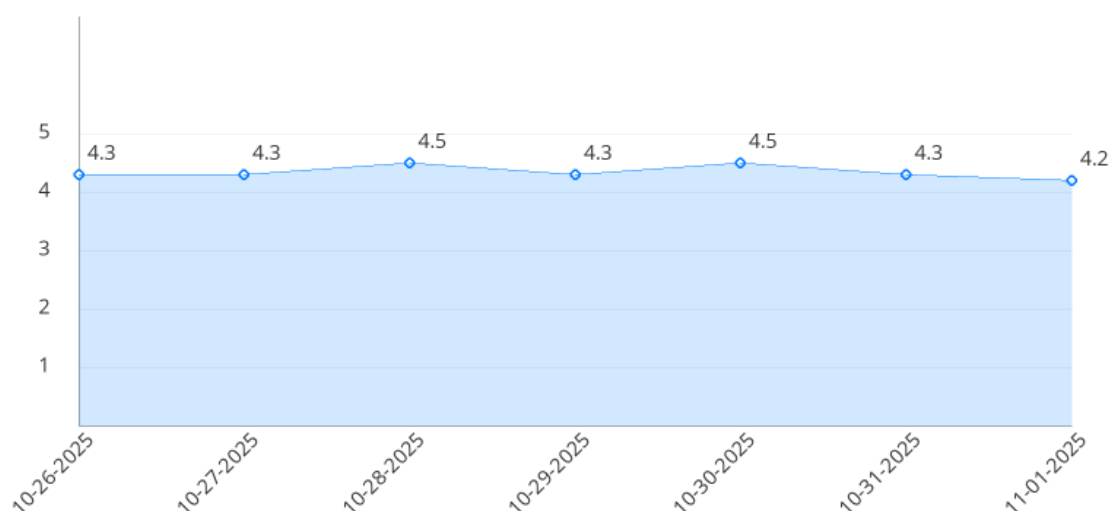

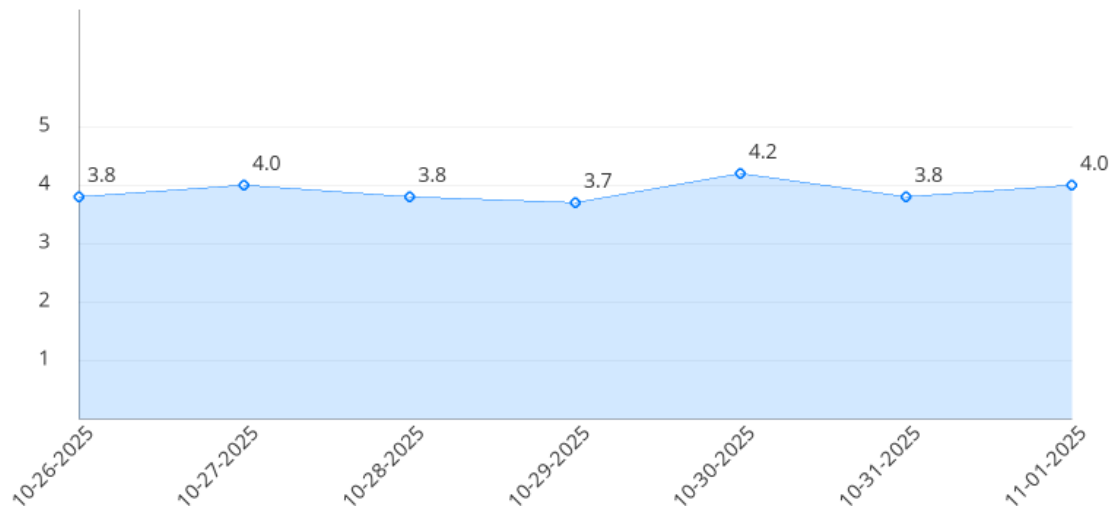

Pandemics



Score Trend (Week of October 26–1, 2025)



This week, the pandemic risk level fluctuated between moderate and high, primarily due to ongoing outbreaks of avian flu, measles, and MERS. The decline in COVID-19 activity provided some relief, but concerns remain high due to the spread of these other infectious diseases. Public health misinformation and vaccine hesitancy continue to exacerbate the situation, hindering effective vaccination efforts. The risk scores ranged from 3.7 to 4.2, indicating a persistent threat level that requires continued vigilance and action. Efforts to combat misinformation and improve vaccine uptake are critical to managing these concurrent health challenges.



Pandemics

Recommended Risk Reduction Actions

- **[Government]** Enhance surveillance and rapid response capabilities for emerging infectious diseases, particularly avian flu and MERS.
- **[NGO]** Increase public awareness and education campaigns to counteract misinformation about vaccines and promote vaccination.
- **[Healthcare]** Implement targeted vaccination campaigns in regions experiencing measles outbreaks to control the spread.
- **[Industry]** Accelerate research and development of universal vaccines and novel therapeutics to address multiple infectious threats.
- **[Community Leaders]** Engage with local communities to build trust and encourage participation in vaccination programs.

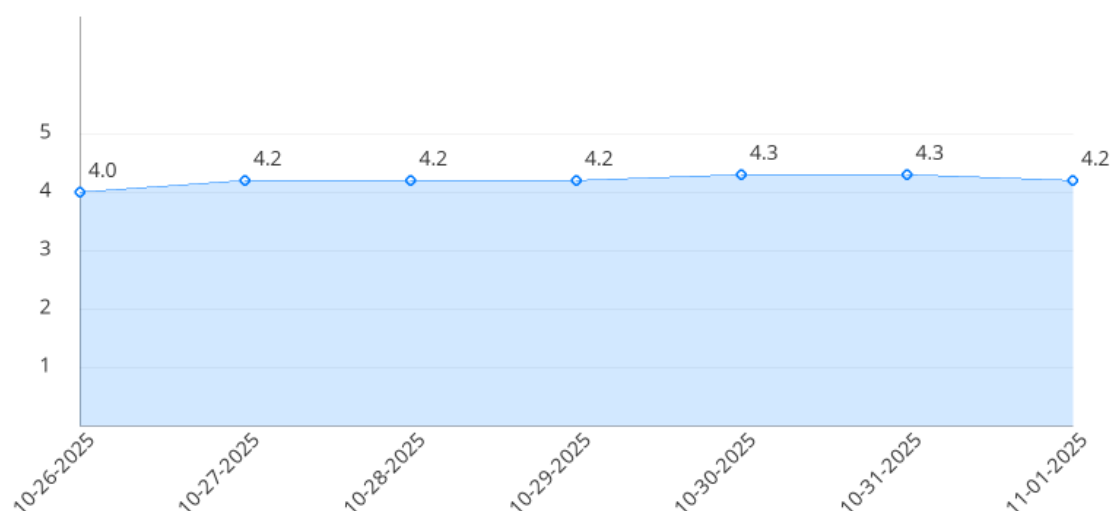

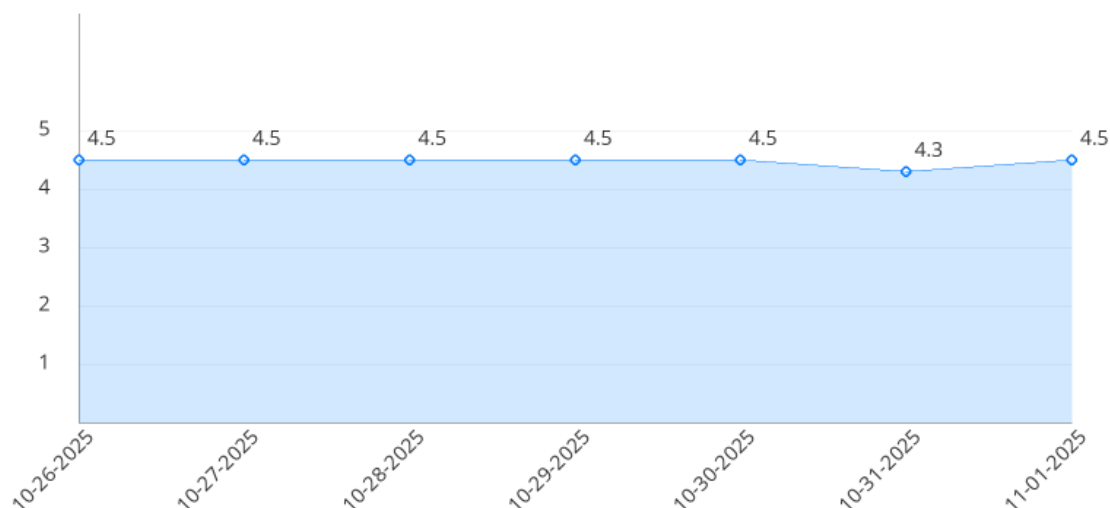
