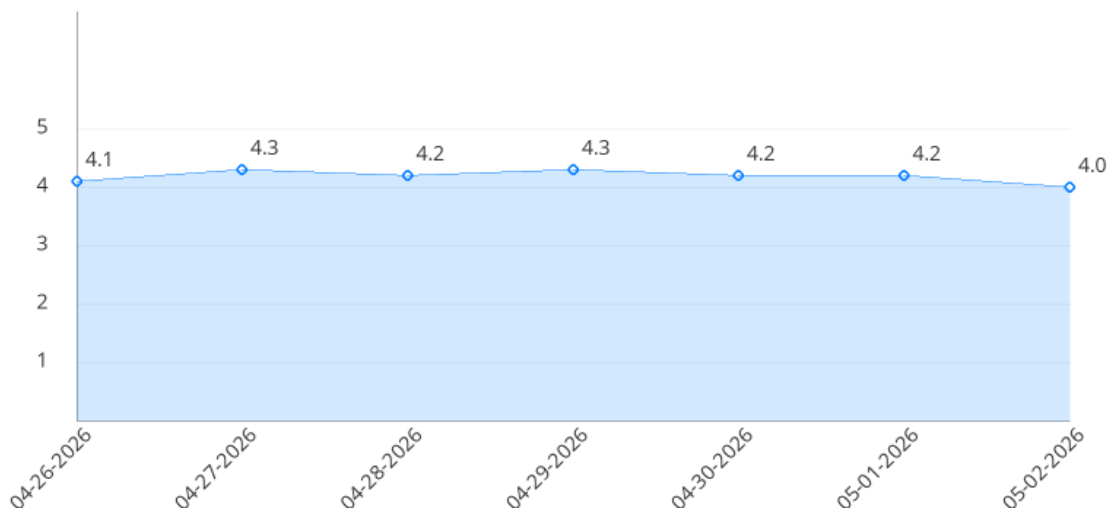

Nuclear War

Score Trend (Week of April 26–2, 2026)

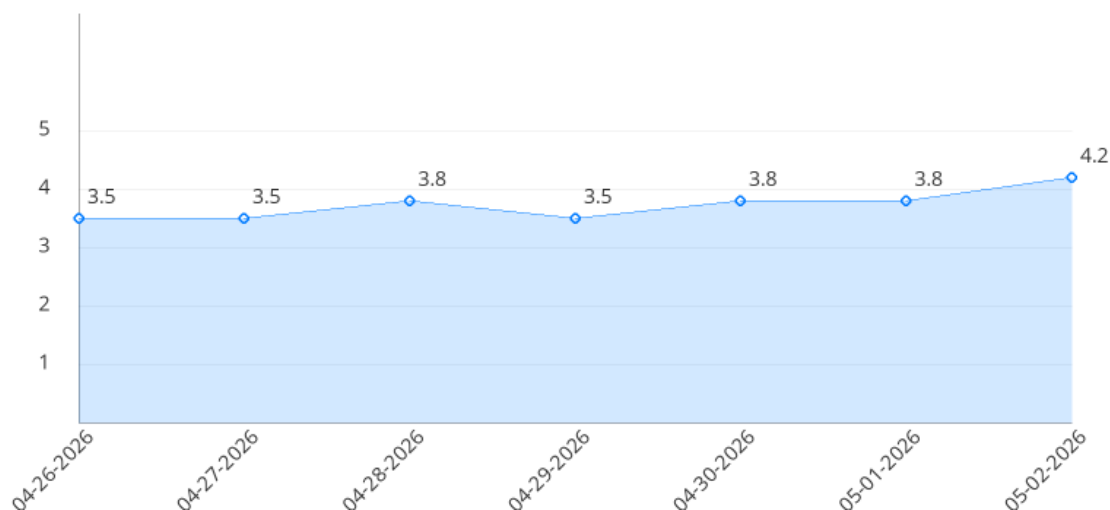

This week, the risk associated with Artificial Intelligence (AI) has been consistently moderate, with a notable increase to a high level on May 2nd. 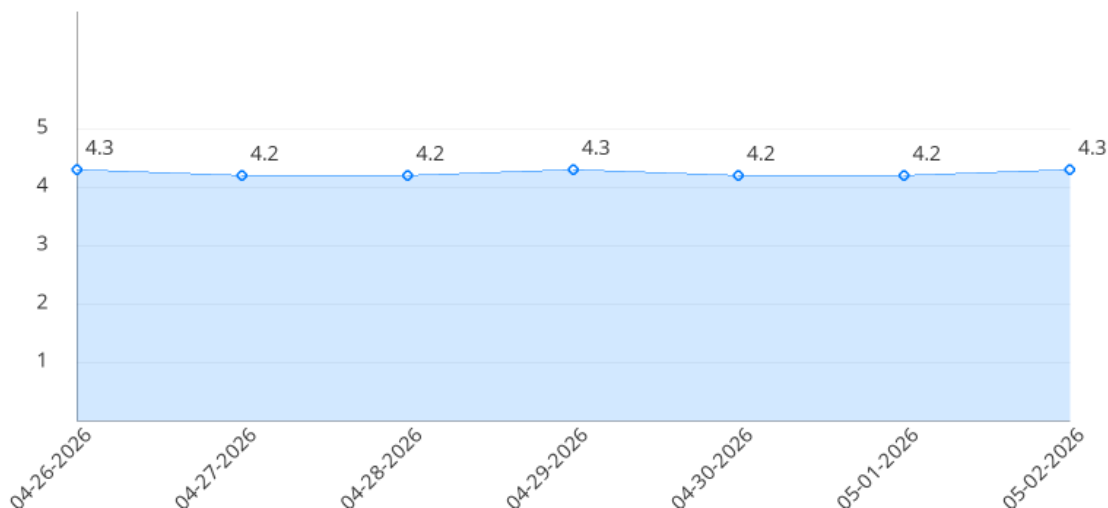
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Climate Change

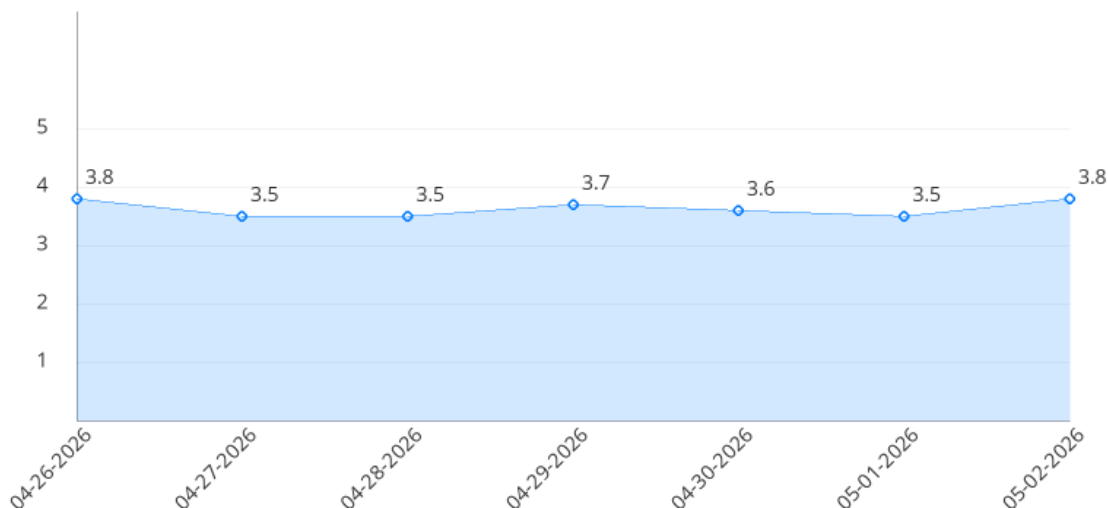

Score Trend (Week of April 26–2, 2026)



This week, the pandemic risk remains moderate, with a consistent score around 3.5 to 3.8, due to several ongoing challenges. These include the spread of COVID-19 variants, avian flu, and MERS, compounded by significant vaccine hesitancy and misinformation. Long COVID continues to be a concern, impacting public health strategies. Surveillance challenges are also noted, which affect the ability to track and respond to these infectious disease threats effectively. The persistent issues of vaccine hesitancy and misinformation are highlighted as key factors undermining public health responses.

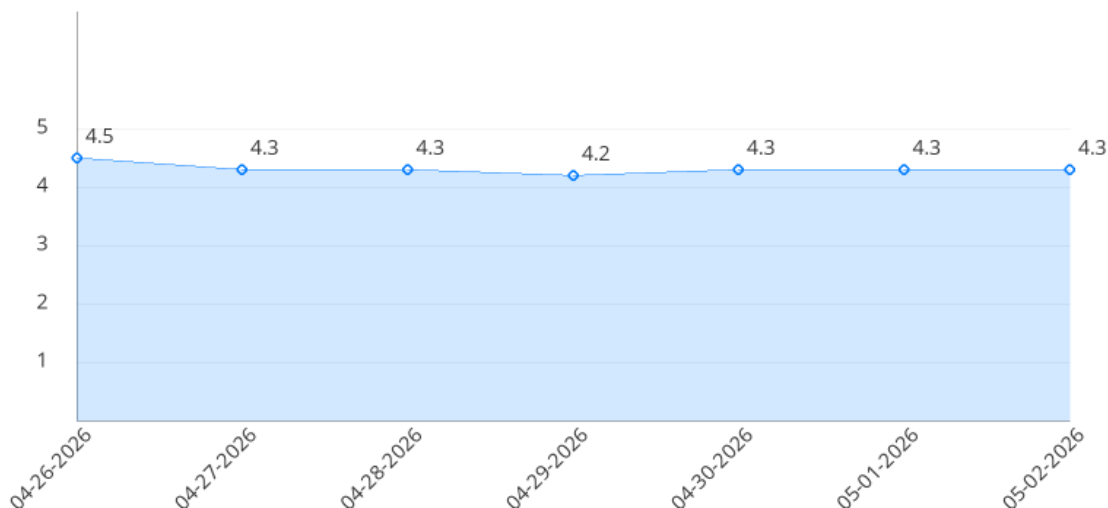

Score Trend (Week of April 26–2, 2026)



This week, the global misinformation threat remains high, largely driven by the proliferation of AI-generated content, deepfakes, and politically charged falsehoods. The risk scores have consistently hovered around 4.3 to 4.5, indicating a persistent and significant threat level. The sophistication of AI technology is enabling the creation of convincing fake content, which is being used in disinformation campaigns and scams, impacting public perception and decision-making. High-profile events are particularly vulnerable to these false narratives, which are often politically motivated or state-sponsored. The ongoing challenge is to develop effective strategies to detect, counter, and educate the public about these evolving threats.



Information Integrity

Recommended Risk Reduction Actions

- **[Government]** Implement stricter regulations and penalties for the creation and dissemination of AI-generated misinformation and deepfakes.
- **[Industry]** Enhance AI detection tools to identify and flag AI-generated misinformation more effectively across digital platforms.
- **[NGO]** Increase efforts in fact-checking and provide clear labels on verified information to guide public understanding and counteract false narratives.
- **[Education]** Develop and integrate media literacy programs to help the public identify and critically evaluate misinformation.
- **[International Bodies]** Collaborate with tech companies and governments to create awareness campaigns about the dangers of misinformation and how to combat it.

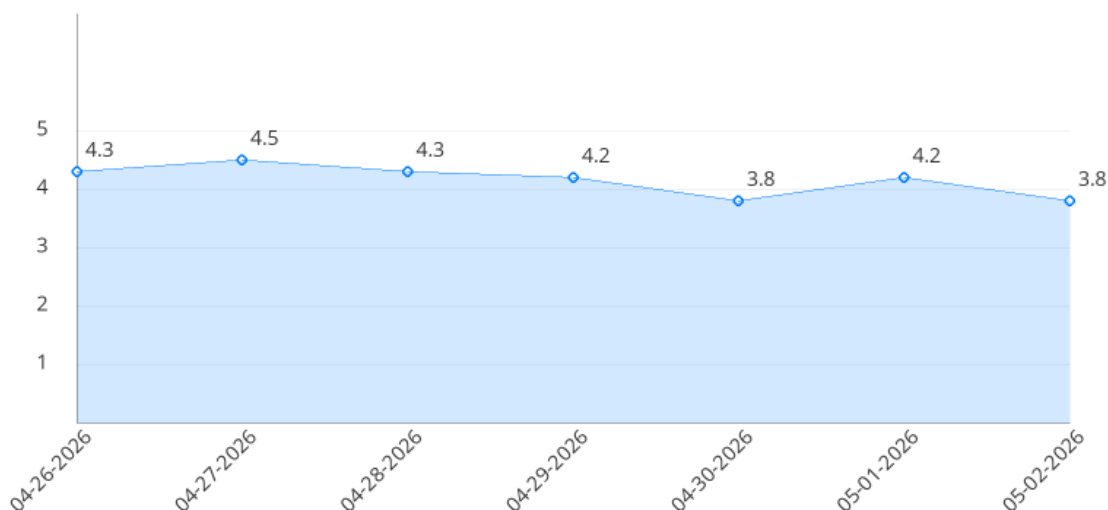

Score Trend (Week of April 26–2, 2026)



This week, the aluminum market is experiencing a 'black swan' supply shock due to ongoing conflicts in the Middle East, which is causing significant disruptions in global supply chains and economic stability. The situation is exacerbated by geopolitical tensions and highlights vulnerabilities in the global supply chain for critical materials like aluminum. Additionally, the detection of extreme subsidence in Mexico City by space missions indicates a potential geophysical black swan event, posing risks to urban infrastructure. Meanwhile, Europe's regional airports are facing an existential threat from a jet fuel crisis, compounded by political turmoil, which could lead to significant disruptions in air travel and economic stability. These events underscore the need for strategic planning and international cooperation to mitigate the impacts of such unforeseen disruptions.

- **[NGO]** Advocate for sustainable and alternative materials to reduce reliance on aluminum and enhance supply chain resilience.
- **[Research Institutions]** Conduct comprehensive research to understand the underlying causes and potential future risks of subsidence in Mexico City.
- **[Airlines]** Develop alternative fuel strategies and enhance operational efficiency to reduce dependency on volatile fuel markets.
