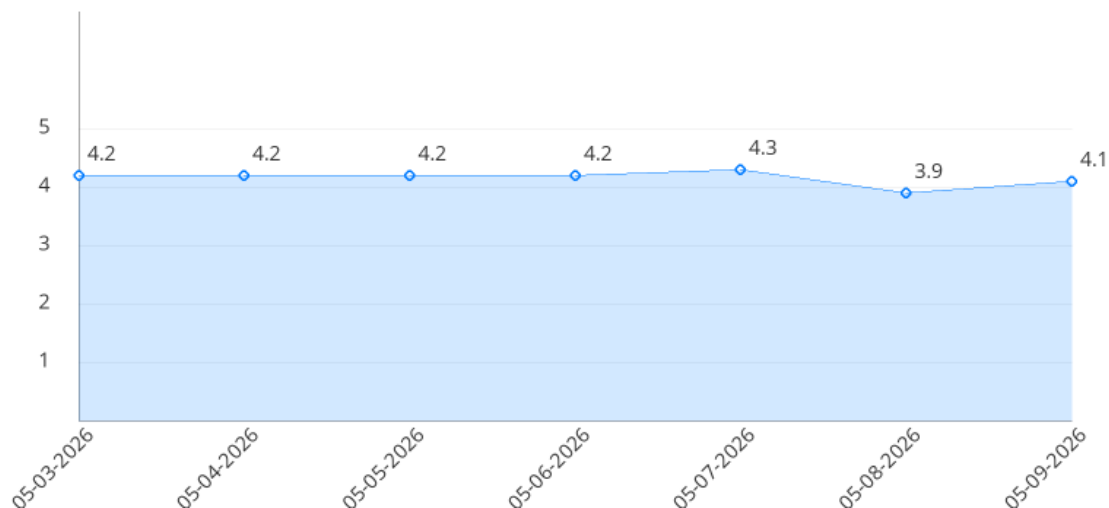

Nuclear War

Score Trend (Week of May 3–9, 2026)



This week, the nuclear threat level remains elevated due to a combination of factors including Iran's nuclear ambitions, North Korea's defiance of non-proliferation treaties, and the modernization of nuclear arsenals. Tensions are further exacerbated by potential nuclear escalation in Ukraine and ambiguous claims regarding Japan's nuclear posture. - **[Military]** Conduct joint exercises focused on de-escalation and crisis management to build trust among nuclear-armed states.

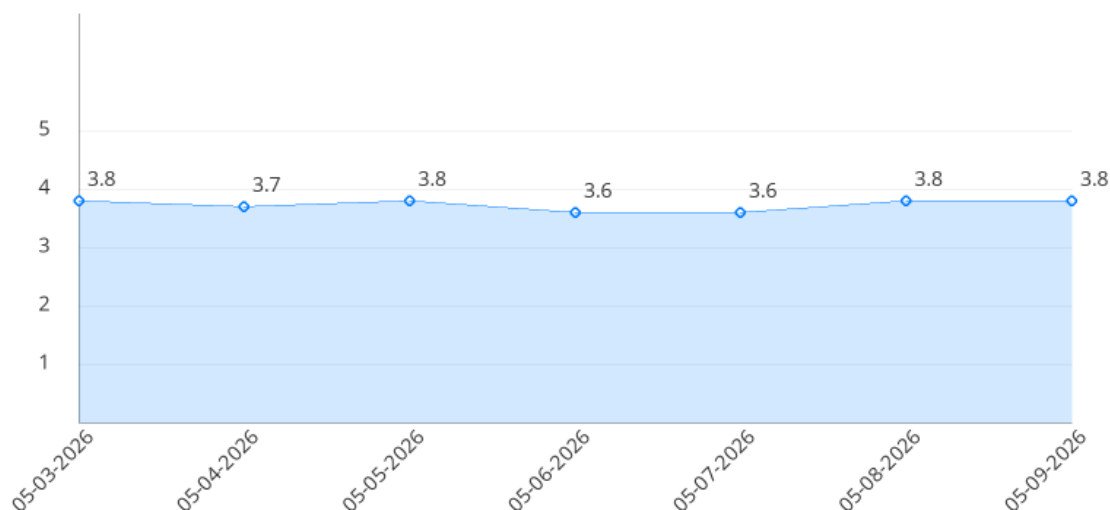

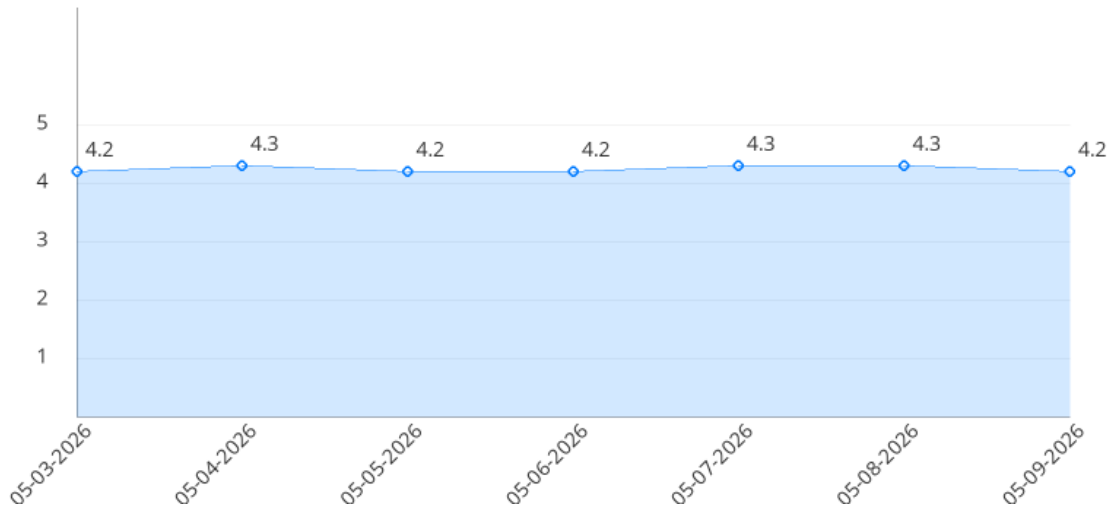

Score Trend (Week of May 3–9, 2026)



This week, the climate risk remains high due to a combination of factors, including the increasing frequency and intensity of extreme weather events, significant ecological impacts, and persistent policy challenges. The Amazon rainforest is nearing a critical tipping point, which, along with ongoing environmental changes, poses severe risks to global ecosystems and biodiversity. Legal and policy hurdles continue to impede effective climate action, while economic and health impacts from climate change are becoming more pronounced. The situation is exacerbated by inadequate infrastructure protection and rising microplastic emissions, highlighting the urgent need for comprehensive and coordinated responses to mitigate these risks.

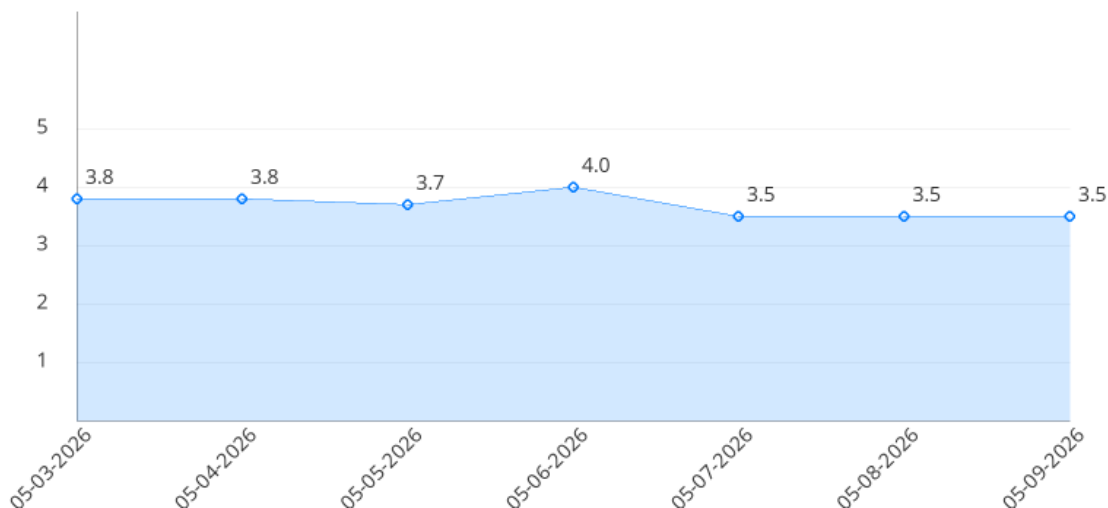

Score Trend (Week of May 3–9, 2026)



This week, the pandemic risk level has fluctuated between moderate and high, primarily due to ongoing outbreaks of hantavirus, particularly on a cruise ship, and avian flu. Challenges persist with vaccine hesitancy and misinformation, which complicate efforts to manage these outbreaks. The risk level peaked mid-week due to concerns about potential human-to-human transmission of hantavirus. Ongoing issues with COVID-19, including long COVID, continue to contribute to the overall risk assessment. Efforts to address these challenges include enhancing surveillance, improving vaccine deployment, and combating misinformation.

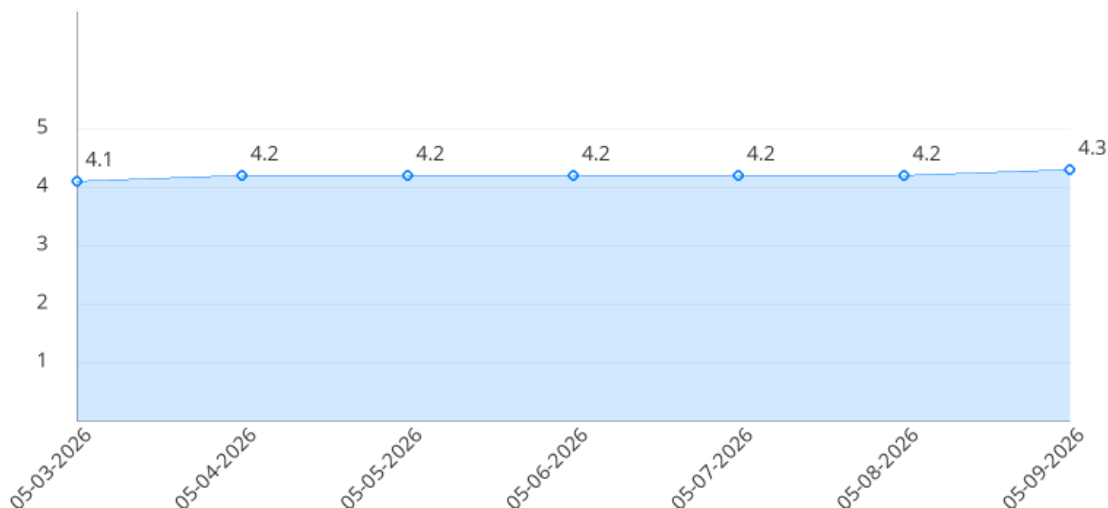

Score Trend (Week of May 3–9, 2026)



This week, the global threat level from misinformation and disinformation remains high, with consistent scores of 4.2 and a peak at 4.3. The primary drivers are the proliferation of deepfakes, AI-generated content, and targeted disinformation campaigns affecting various domains such as politics, health, and climate change. These developments are compounded by the use of digital platforms for spreading false claims and scams, which undermine public trust and safety. Additionally, disinformation laws in some regions are reportedly suppressing journalism, further complicating the landscape of information integrity. The situation calls for enhanced detection, regulation, and public education efforts to mitigate the risks associated with these trends.

Recommended Risk Reduction Actions

- **[Government]** Implement stricter regulations and penalties for the creation and dissemination of deepfakes and AI-generated misinformation, particularly in critical areas like health and elections.
- **[Industry]** Collaborate with tech firms to develop and deploy advanced AI detection tools to identify and flag deepfake content and misinformation across digital platforms.
- **[NGO]** Launch public awareness campaigns to educate citizens on identifying and reporting misinformation, emphasizing the risks associated with deepfakes and AI-generated content.
- **[Education]** Integrate media literacy programs into school curricula to equip students with skills to critically evaluate information sources and recognize misinformation.
- **[International Organizations]** Collaborate globally to uphold journalistic integrity and resist oppressive disinformation laws that threaten press freedom.

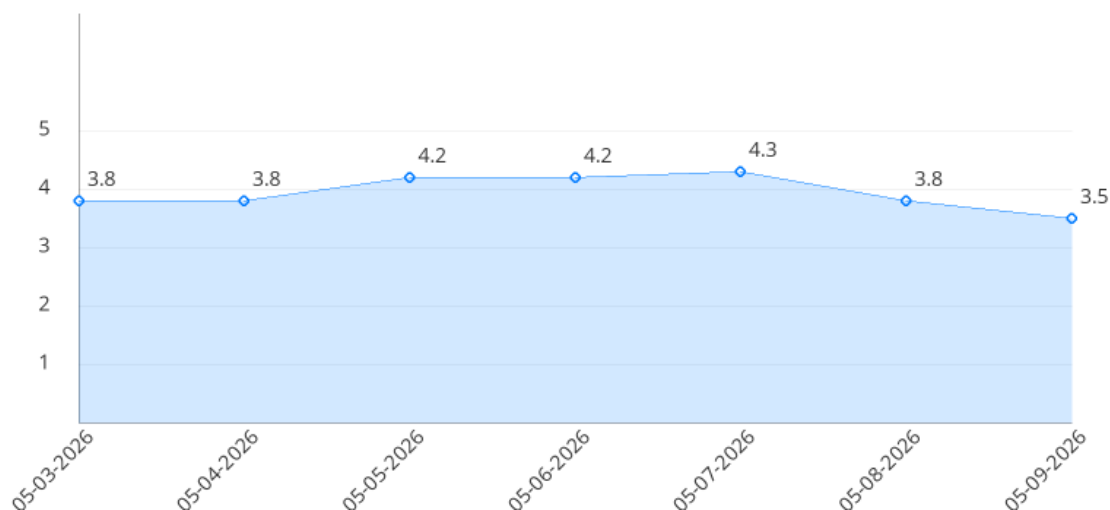

Score Trend (Week of May 3–9, 2026)



This week, the primary focus of existential-risk analysis has been on the escalating geopolitical tensions between Guyana and Venezuela over the Esequibo region, which is rich in oil resources. This dispute has been highlighted as a significant geopolitical risk with potential for regional destabilization and international conflict, with scores indicating a high level of concern. Concurrently, there are ongoing concerns about Iran's potential deployment of high-altitude electromagnetic pulse (HEMP) weapons, which pose a significant threat to global infrastructure. These developments underscore the unpredictability and potential for 'black swan' events that could have widespread implications for regional and global stability.

- **[Media]** Provide balanced coverage to inform the public and stakeholders about the complexities and potential implications of the Guyana-Venezuela territorial dispute.

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Week in Review: May 3–9, 2026



This week, existential risk trends across various domains show a mix of elevated and moderate concerns. In the nuclear domain, the risk remains high due to geopolitical tensions involving Iran, North Korea, and potential nuclear escalation in Ukraine, emphasizing the need for diplomatic interventions. Artificial Intelligence risks are moderate, with ongoing concerns about cybersecurity, ethical considerations, and the concentration of power, prompting calls for improved transparency and regulatory oversight. Climate change risks are high, driven by extreme weather events and ecological impacts, highlighting the need for coordinated mitigation efforts. Pandemic risks fluctuate between moderate and high, with outbreaks of hantavirus and avian flu, alongside persistent challenges from COVID-19. Information integrity remains a high concern due to the spread of misinformation and disinformation, necessitating enhanced detection and regulation.
