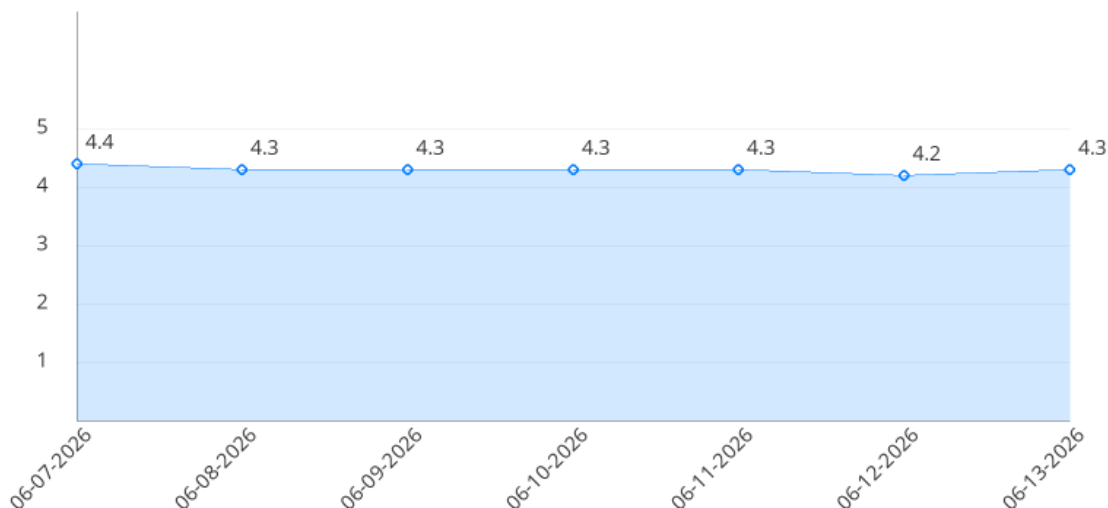

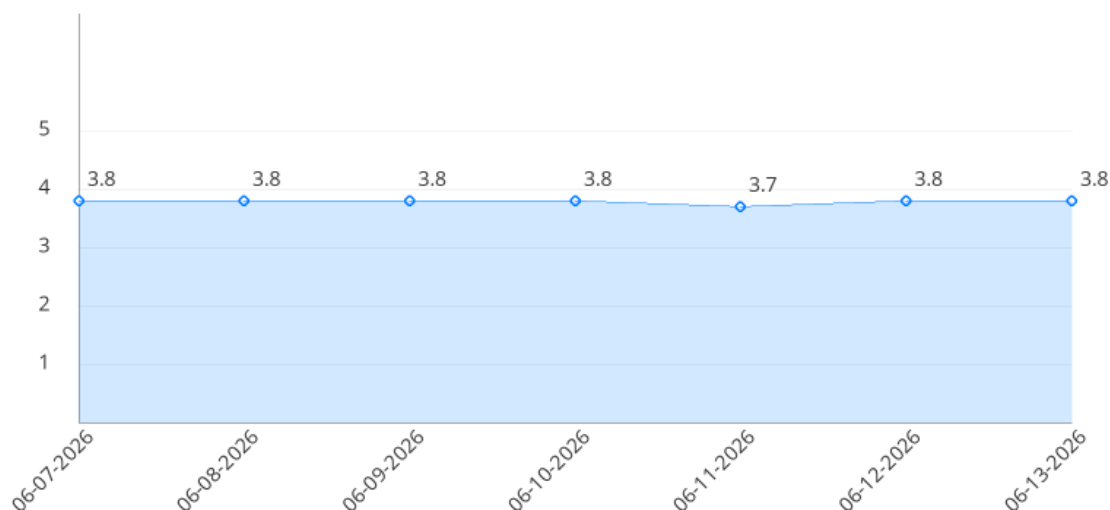

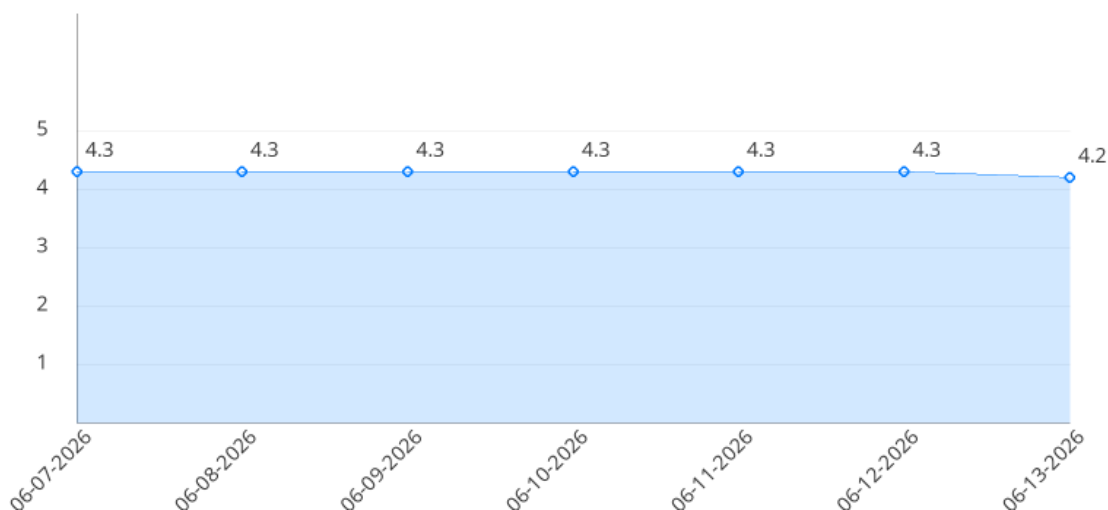
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Climate Change

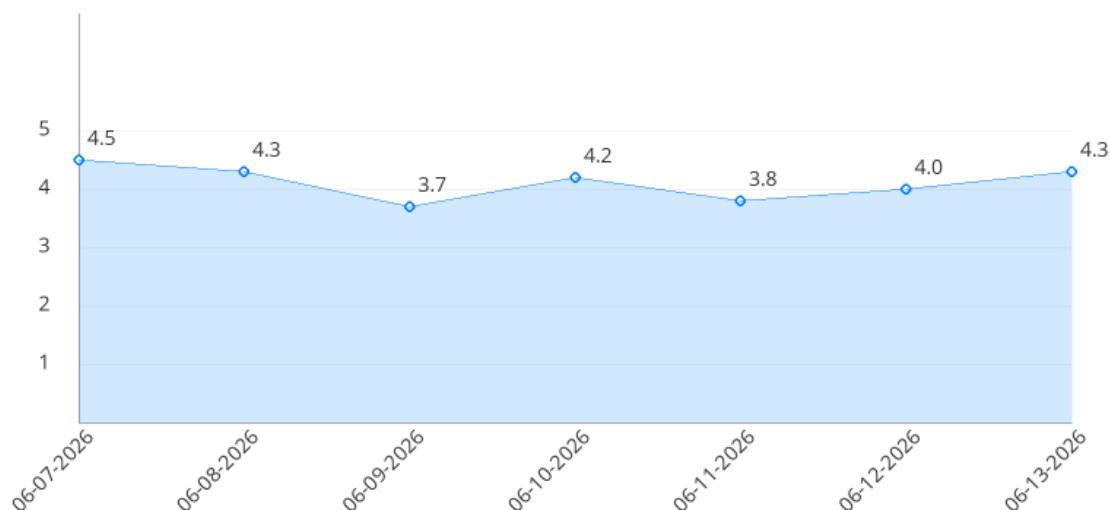
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Pandemics

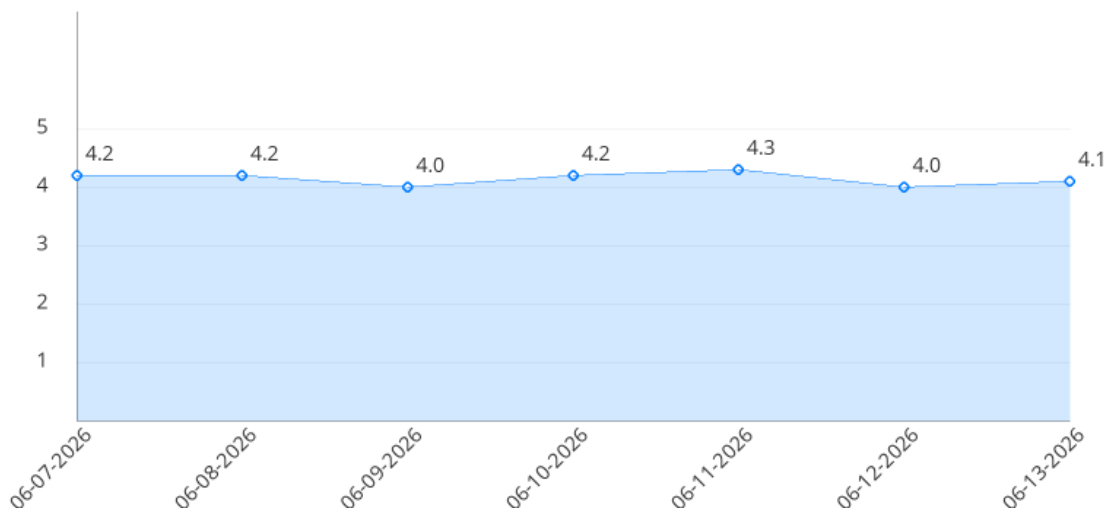
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Information Integrity

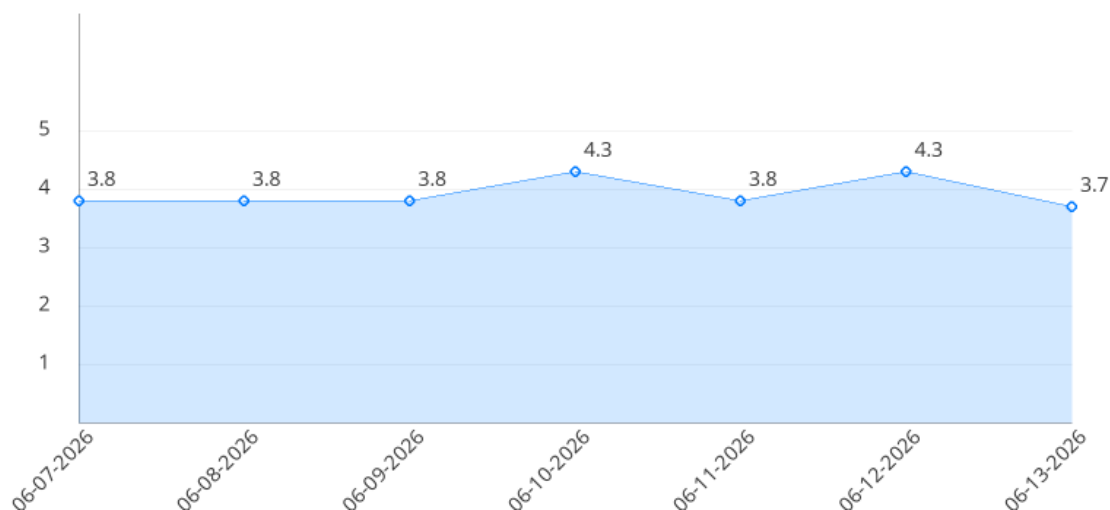
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Unknown / Black Swan
