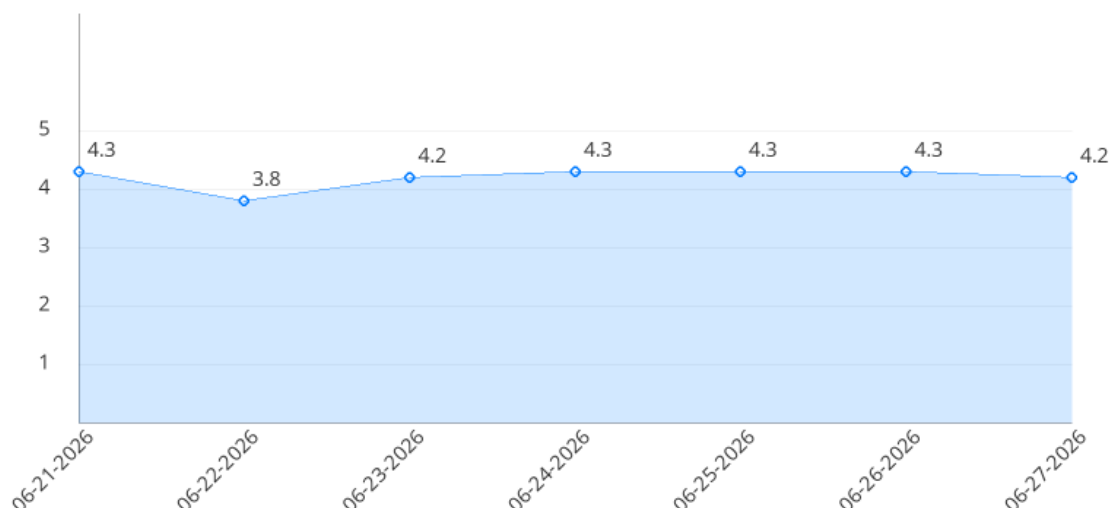

Nuclear War

Score Trend (Week of June 21–27, 2026)



This week, the nuclear threat level has been elevated due to several developments. Finland's decision to lift its nuclear weapons ban has intensified tensions between NATO and Russia. Concurrently, concerns about Iran's nuclear program and North Korea's aggressive nuclear advancements have further contributed to the precarious nuclear environment. The erosion of global nuclear treaties and the breakdown of communication channels among nuclear-armed states have exacerbated the situation, increasing the risk of miscalculation and escalation. These developments underscore the urgent need for renewed diplomatic efforts and strengthened arms control measures.

- **[NATO]** Enhance communication channels and confidence-building measures with Russia to prevent misunderstandings and reduce the risk of escalation.
- **[NGO]** Launch public awareness campaigns on the risks of nuclear proliferation and the importance of arms control treaties.
- **[Technology]** Invest in technologies that improve verification and monitoring of nuclear activities globally to support non-proliferation efforts.

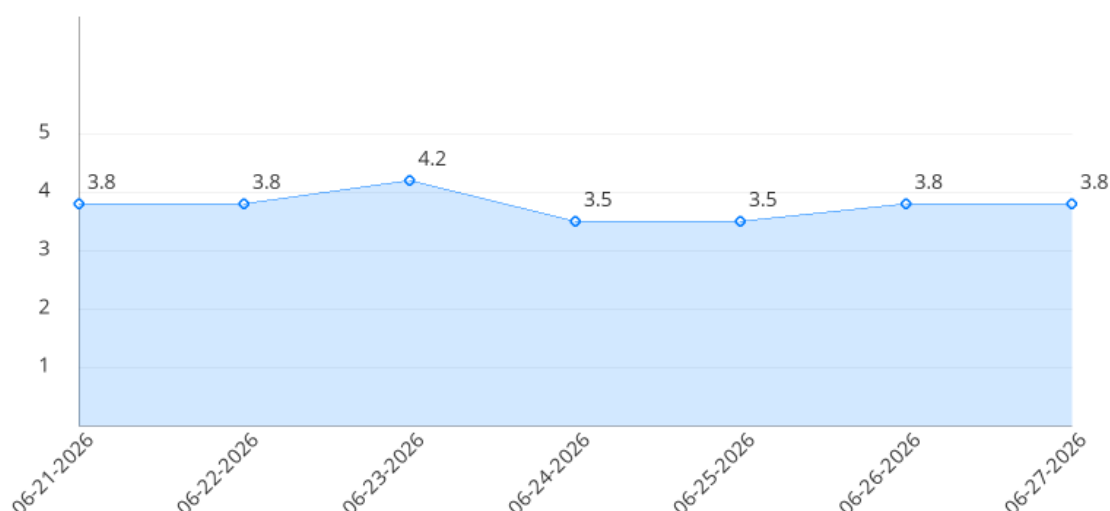

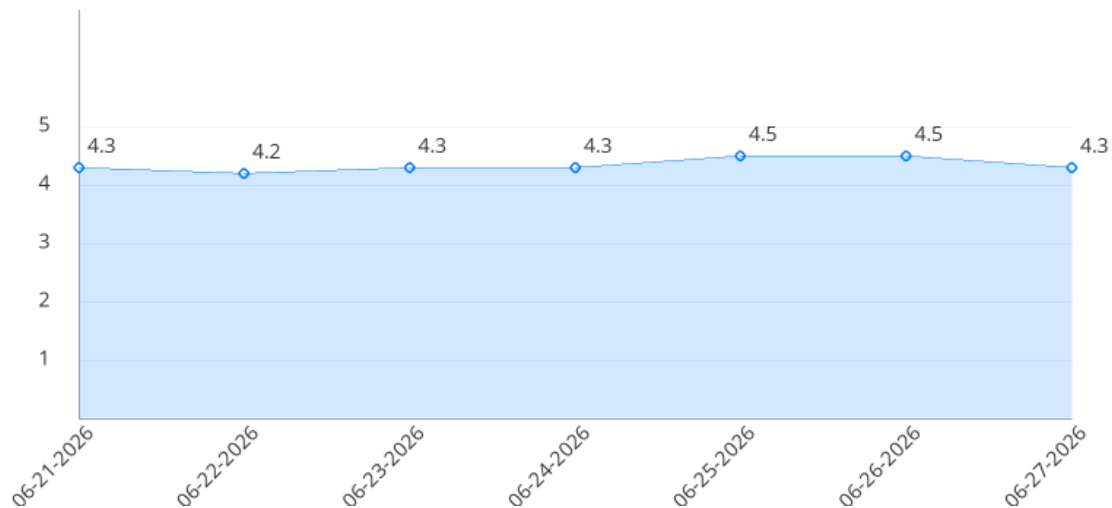

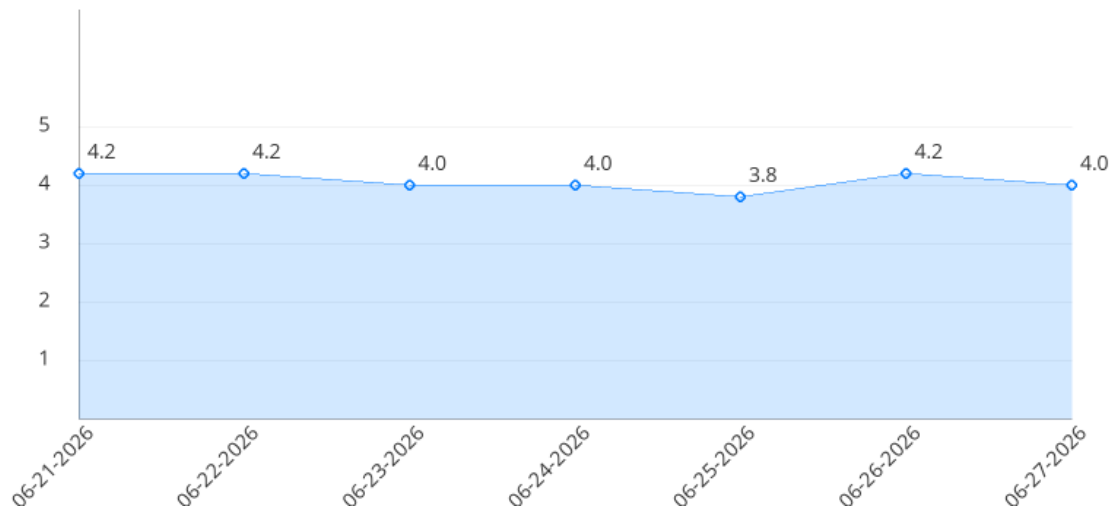

Score Trend (Week of June 21–27, 2026)



This week, the pandemic risk remains high due to ongoing Ebola outbreaks, flu surges, and the impacts of long COVID. The situation is exacerbated by vaccine hesitancy and the spread of misinformation, which hinder effective public health responses. Avian flu detections and a resurgence of measles further contribute to the elevated risk level. Although there was a slight dip in the risk score mid-week, the overall trend indicates persistent challenges in managing infectious disease threats. Efforts to address these issues include enhancing public health messaging, improving vaccine distribution, and strengthening surveillance systems.

- **[Government]** Increase funding and resources for Ebola outbreak containment and cross-border monitoring in affected regions.
- **[Public Health Organizations]** Enhance public health messaging to counter misinformation and promote vaccine uptake, especially in communities with low vaccination rates.
- **[Healthcare Providers]** Support mental health services and resources for long COVID patients to address chronic health impacts.
- **[International Organizations]** Coordinate global efforts to ensure equitable vaccine distribution and address gaps in vaccine coverage.
- **[Research Institutions]** Accelerate research on long COVID and develop strategies to mitigate its long-term impacts.

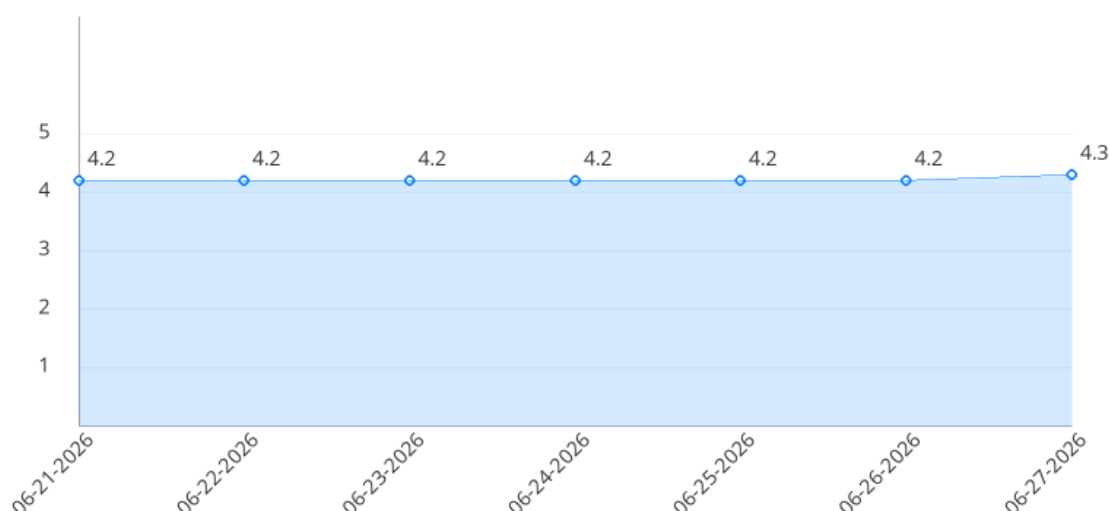

Score Trend (Week of June 21–27, 2026)



This week, the global risk of misinformation remains high, with a consistent score of 4.2 to 4.3. The primary drivers include election-related falsehoods, health misinformation, and geopolitical disinformation campaigns. A significant factor exacerbating these issues is the proliferation of AI-generated content, which is being used to create fake information and scams. These developments are contributing to increased political and social tensions worldwide, highlighting the urgent need for effective countermeasures. The trend underscores the importance of enhancing detection systems, implementing stricter regulations, and increasing public awareness to combat misinformation effectively.

Recommended Risk Reduction Actions

- **[Government]** Implement stricter regulations and penalties for the creation and distribution of AI-generated misinformation.
- **[Industry]** Enhance AI detection tools to better identify and flag AI-generated fake content across platforms.
- **[NGO]** Increase public awareness campaigns about the risks of misinformation and how to identify it.
- **[Education]** Integrate digital literacy programs into curricula to equip individuals with skills to discern misinformation.
- **[International]** Foster collaboration between countries to address and mitigate the impact of cross-border disinformation campaigns.

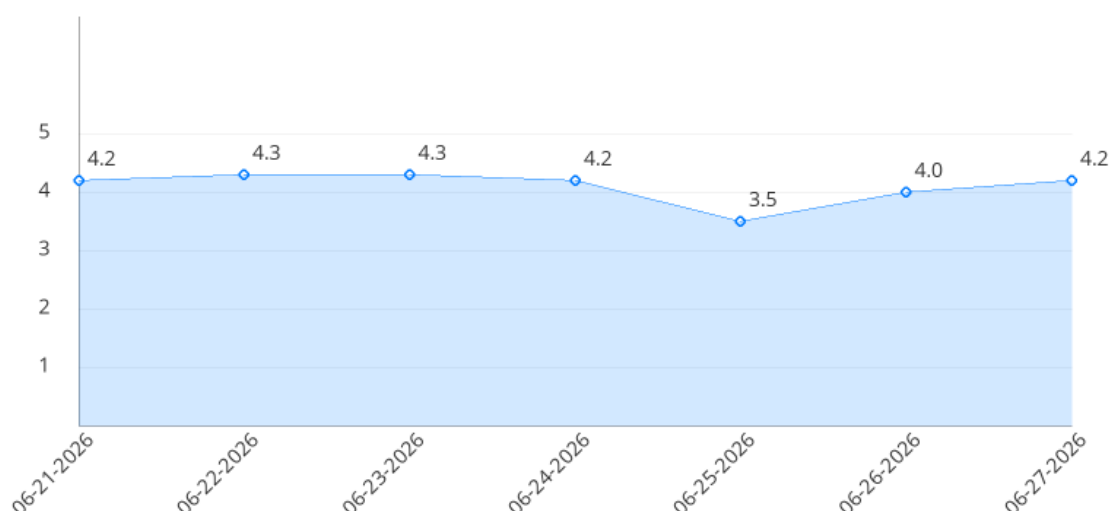

Additionally, a new potential Black Swan event has emerged concerning the uncertain future of quantum technologies, which poses an existential threat to national security, particularly for the US military. This highlights the dual nature of current unknown risks, combining traditional geopolitical tensions with emerging technological threats. The need for strategic responses to both immediate and long-term risks is evident, requiring coordinated efforts across various sectors.

- **[NGO]** Facilitate public awareness campaigns about the implications of quantum technology on global security and the importance of diversifying energy sources.
- **[Research Institutions]** Increase funding and research into quantum technologies to better understand and mitigate potential threats to national and global security.

Artificial Intelligence risks remain moderate to high, driven by concerns about its misuse and the necessity for international governance frameworks. Climate change risks are underscored by extreme weather events in Europe, emphasizing the urgent need for global mitigation strategies.

Pandemic risks persist, with ongoing outbreaks and vaccine hesitancy complicating public health efforts. Information integrity continues to be challenged by misinformation, particularly election-related and AI-generated content, necessitating stronger countermeasures. In the unknown/black swan category, the Strait of Hormuz crisis and emerging quantum technology threats highlight the complexity of managing both geopolitical and technological risks.
