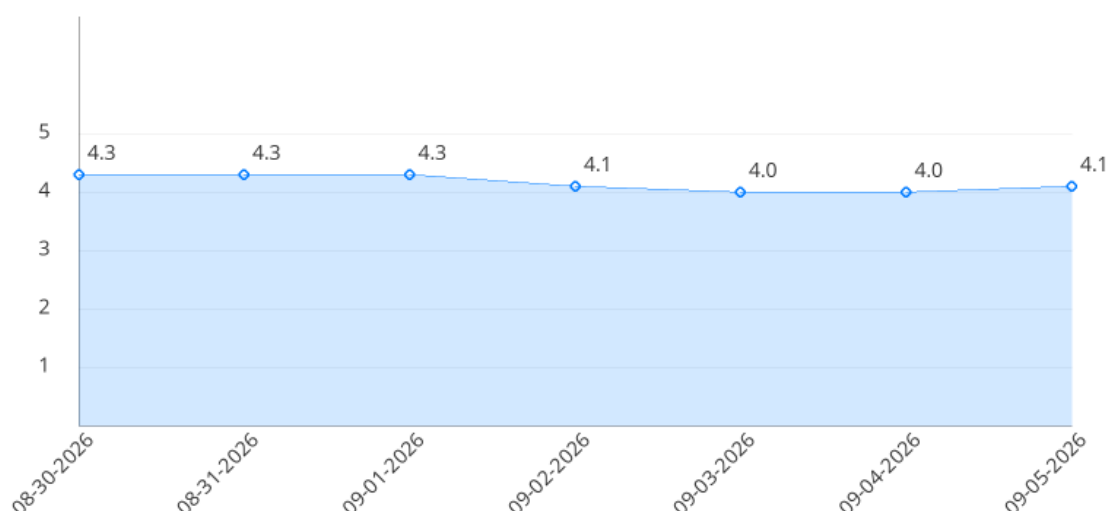

Nuclear War

Score Trend (Week of August 30–5, 2026)



This week, the nuclear threat level remains elevated due to several factors, including Russia's potential use of tactical nuclear weapons in Ukraine, increasing nuclear armament sentiment in South Korea, and ongoing tensions involving Iran and North Korea. Escalatory rhetoric from Russian lawmakers and the breakdown of traditional arms control frameworks have further contributed to the heightened risk. The global situation is marked by strategic posturing and nuclear rhetoric from major powers, raising concerns about potential miscalculations and accidental escalations. Efforts to address these issues through diplomatic channels and arms control agreements are crucial to mitigating the risk of nuclear conflict.

Recommended Risk Reduction Actions

- **[Government]** Convene an emergency summit to address the breakdown of nuclear arms control agreements and explore new frameworks.
- **[NGO]** Advocate for public awareness campaigns on the consequences of nuclear war to build global pressure for disarmament.
- **[Industry]** Invest in technologies that enhance verification and monitoring capabilities for nuclear treaties.
- **[Diplomatic Community]** Facilitate urgent dialogues between nuclear-armed states to address and de-escalate current tensions.
- **[International Organizations]** Strengthen and expand crisis communication channels between nuclear-armed states to prevent misunderstandings and accidental escalations.

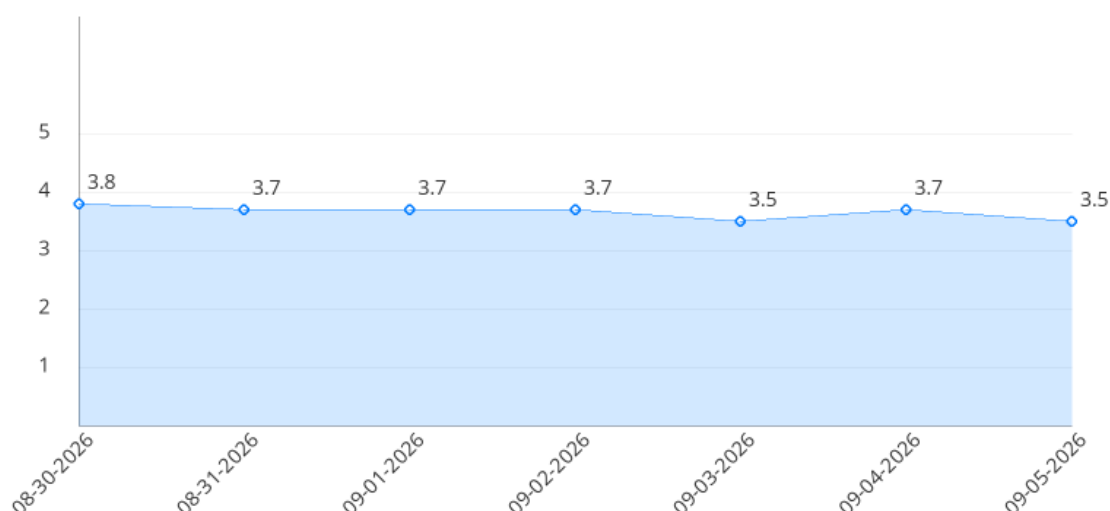

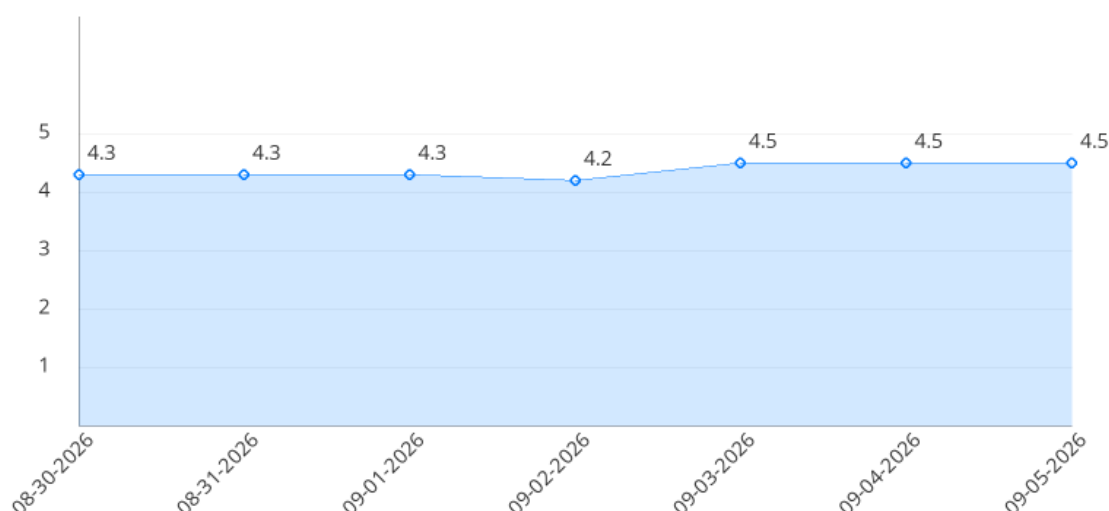

Climate Change

Score Trend (Week of August 30–5, 2026)



This week, the focus on climate change has been dominated by the severe impacts of extreme weather events and the imminent surpassing of critical global warming thresholds. - **[International Organizations]** Facilitate global cooperation and funding to support climate adaptation and mitigation efforts, particularly in developing countries facing severe climate risks.

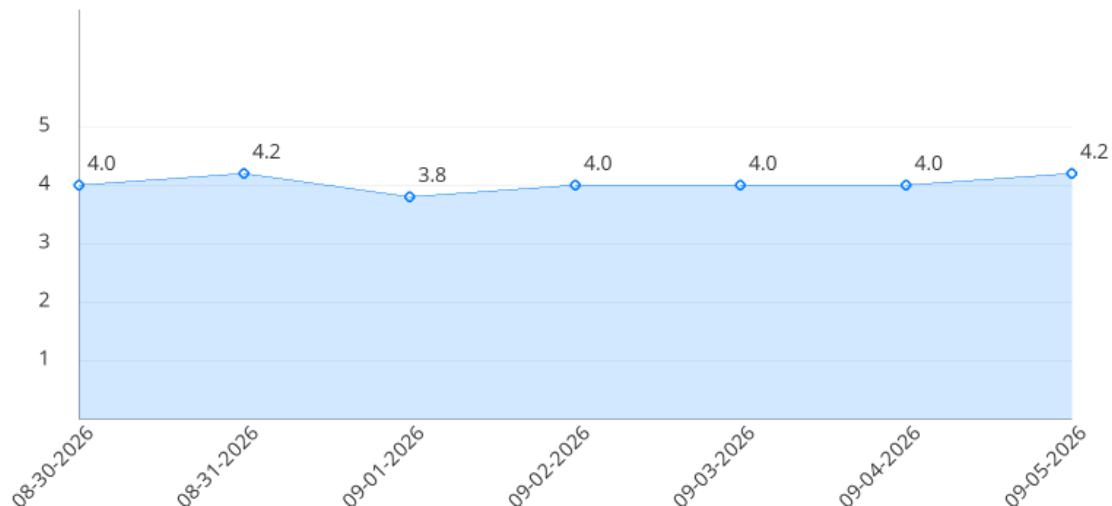

This week, the pandemic risk remains high due to multiple concurrent outbreaks, including measles, avian flu, and Ebola, with persistent challenges from COVID-19 variants and vaccine hesitancy. The risk scores fluctuated slightly but consistently indicated a high threat level, emphasizing the need for robust public health responses. 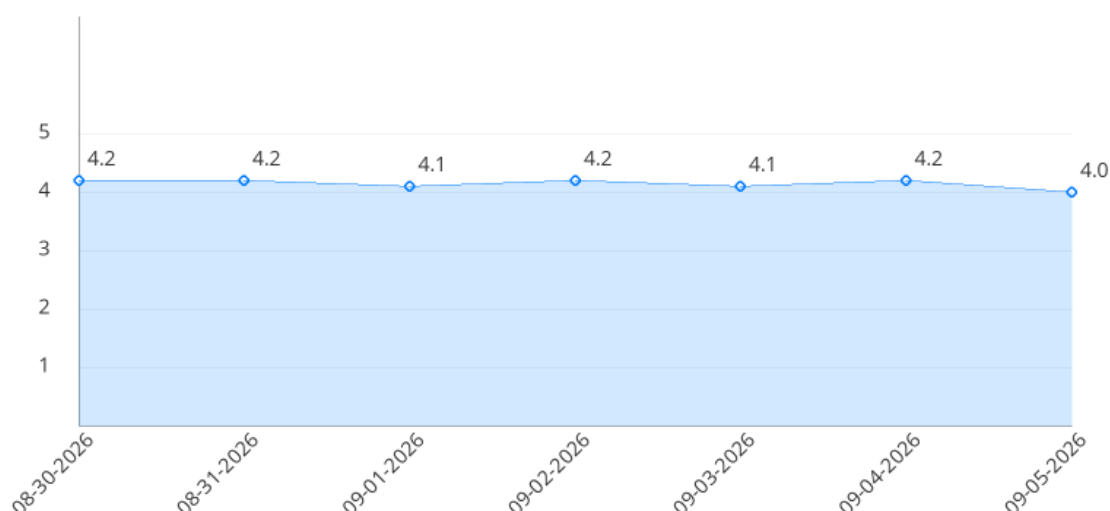

This week, the global misinformation risk remains high, consistently scoring around 4.0 to 4.2. The primary drivers include widespread scams, AI-generated fake content, and targeted disinformation campaigns affecting multiple domains such as political, social, economic, health, and climate issues. The sophistication of AI-generated deepfakes and geopolitical disinformation campaigns are notable concerns, with impacts observed across various sectors globally. The persistence of these threats underscores the need for enhanced detection measures, public awareness, and regulatory frameworks to mitigate the spread of misinformation.



Information Integrity

Recommended Risk Reduction Actions

- **[Government]** Implement stricter regulations and penalties for digital platforms that fail to curb the spread of misinformation, particularly focusing on AI-generated content.
- **[Industry]** Enhance AI and machine learning algorithms to better detect and flag deepfakes and other AI-generated fake content across platforms.
- **[NGO]** Launch public awareness campaigns to educate individuals on recognizing and reporting scams and misinformation, emphasizing the risks in health and climate topics.
- **[Education]** Integrate media literacy programs into curricula to equip students with skills to critically evaluate information and discern credible sources.
- **[International Organizations]** Foster international cooperation to address cross-border disinformation efforts and develop unified strategies to counteract geopolitical disinformation campaigns.

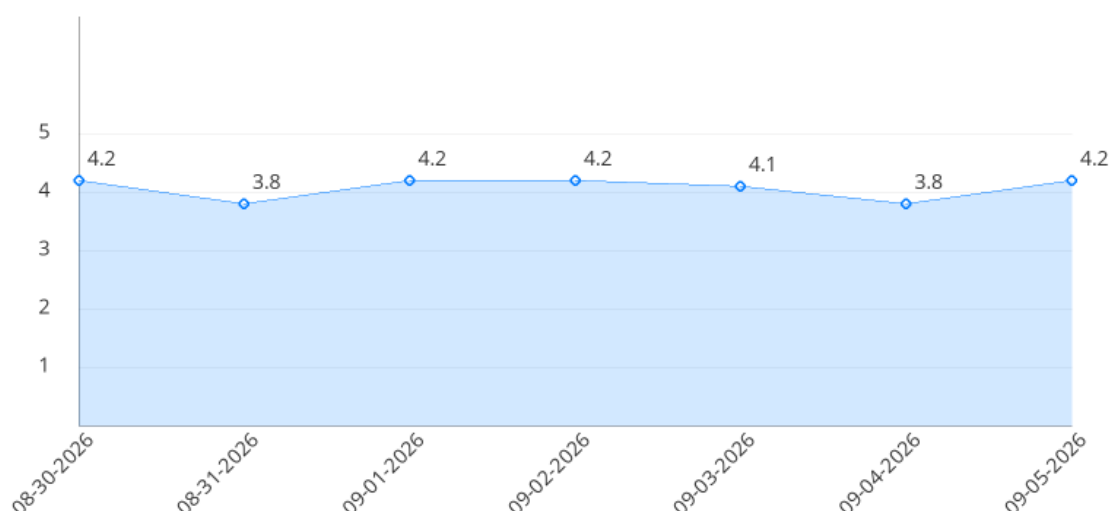
